

Phase 1 & 2. EA Exam Prep and Business Tax

Paid Apprenticeship & US Tax Court Non-Attorney Exam

Veer Tree Fees \$20,000

Year Two Fees $$2\overline{0,000}$.

Participants who have passed all 3 IRS Enrolled Agent Exams will be allowed into the Enrolled Agent Paid Apprenticeship Program

A deposit of \$7000 is due January 31,2025 the remaining balance of \$13.000. is paid through 50% of Client Service Fees Through ProVisions Taxpayer Clinics and referrals. EA apprentice is paid 50% of these fees by providing representation for taxpayers before the Internal Revenue Service in audits, appeals, collections, tax preparations and federal tax litigation.

EA Apprentices will prepare for the US Tax Court Non-Attorney Exam once a week in-person class and on-line.

Phase4

Apprentices who passed the US Tax Bar will have 2 designation.

Enrolled Agent (EA) and United States Tax Court Practitioner (USTCP)

They will serve as the primary tax advocates for their clients and have direct responsibility for their cases

During this phase they will earn 75% of their Clients fees
They will also learn substantive and procedural tax law, case
management, and lawyering skills. EA's will also give services to
international businesses, community groups and nonprofit
organizations. They will help US taxpayers abroad to know their
rights, responsibilities and assist them in overcoming tax issues.
Additionally, EA's will have an opportunity to participate in
special projects such as traveling abroad to set up Low Income Tax
Clinics LITC, other administrative guidance in US Own Territories.
